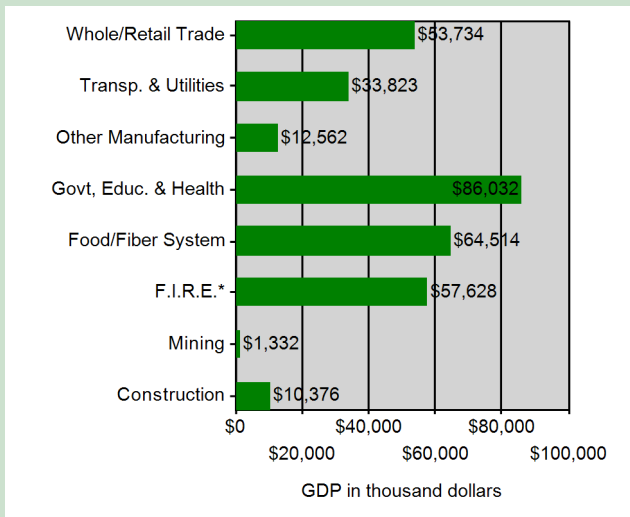


Franklin Parish generates approximately \$320 million in total economic activity in 2004 as measured by Gross Domestic Product (GDP). GDP measures the value-added that is created by the parish. Franklin Parish ranks 48 out of all 64 parishes in GDP created for the state.

Industrial Structure

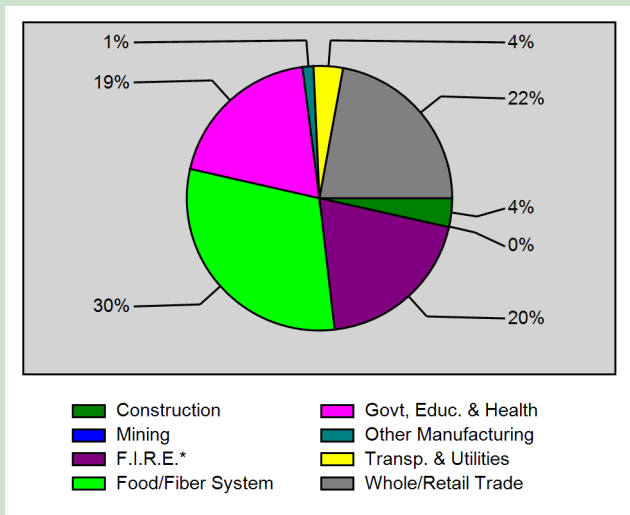
Figure 1: GDP (Value-Added) by major industry in 2004 (thousands of dollars)

The Govt, Educ. & Health sector contributes more to Franklin Parish's GDP than any other sector totaling \$86,032 thousand. A breakdown of each major industry's contribution is shown in Figure 1.

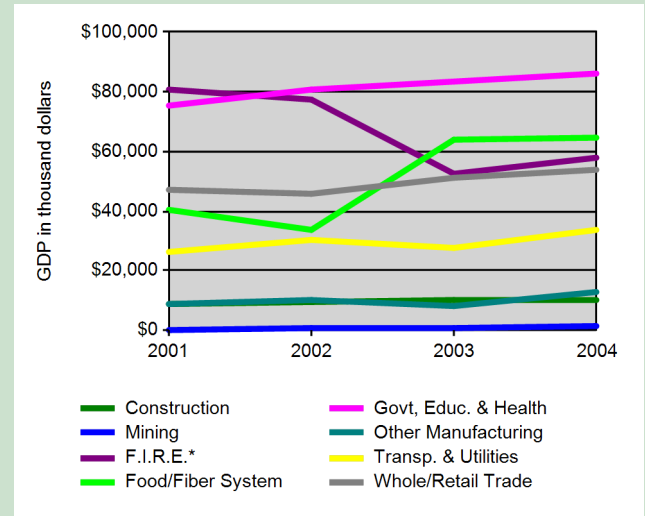
Figure 2: Distribution of Employment by major industry in 2004

The Food/Fiber System sector supplied the most full-time and part-time jobs to the parish in 2004 at 1,680 of the total 5,531 jobs in the parish. The distribution of jobs by major sector is presented in Figure 2.

Growth Trends

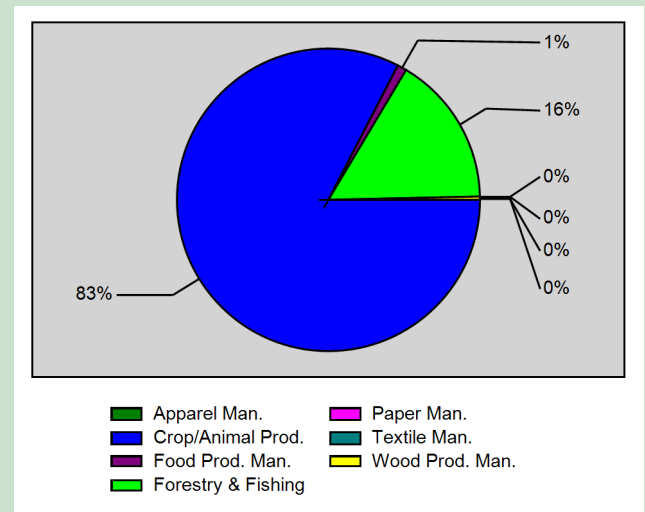
Figure 3: Four year growth in GDP (Value-Added) by major industry between 2001 and 2004

Franklin Parish has seen its economy grow by 11% as measured by GDP (inflation adjusted) between 2001 and 2004. The fastest growing sector during that period was the Mining sector that grew by 663%. The slowest growing sector was the F.I.R.E.* sector that grew by -29%. Franklin saw total full-time and part-time employment grow by -22 jobs, or 0% of total jobs over the four year period. Detailed growth in parish GDP for the most recent four year period is shown in Figure 3.

Food and Fiber System

The Food and Fiber System generates \$64,514 thousand for Franklin Parish's economy and ranks 2 in GDP among the parish's major industrial sectors. The system includes production agriculture, forestry and fishing sectors as well as food and fiber manufacturing (processing) sectors. These food and fiber product sectors generate \$58,475 thousand and supply 1,400 jobs. The distribution of GDP by each food and fiber product sector is presented in Figure 4.

This Food and Fiber System also includes food service and drinking establishments that generate \$6,039 thousand in GDP and supply 280 jobs to the parish.
