


Jefferson Parish generates approximately \$17,474 million in total economic activity in 2004 as measured by Gross Domestic Product (GDP). GDP measures the value-added that is created by the parish. Jefferson Parish ranks 3 out of all 64 parishes in GDP created for the state.

Industrial Structure


Figure 1: GDP (Value-Added) by major industry in 2004 (thousands of dollars)

The F.I.R.E.* sector contributes more to Jefferson Parish's GDP than any other sector totaling \$6,771,462 thousand. A breakdown of each major industry's contribution is shown in Figure 1.

* F.I.R.E. includes Finance, Insurance, Real Estate and Other Services sectors.


Figure 2: Distribution of Employment by major industry in 2004

The F.I.R.E.* sector supplied the most full-time and part-time jobs to the parish in 2004 at 66,135 of the total 204,733 jobs in the parish. The distribution of jobs by major sector is presented in Figure 2.

Growth Trends


Figure 3: Four year growth in GDP (Value-Added) by major industry between 2001 and 2004

Jefferson Parish has seen its economy grow by 18% as measured by GDP (inflation adjusted) between 2001 and 2004. The fastest growing sector during that period was the Mining sector that grew by 56%. The slowest growing sector was the Transp. & Utilities sector that grew by -16%. Jefferson saw total full-time and part-time employment grow by -8,583 jobs, or -4% of total jobs over the four year period. Detailed growth in parish GDP for the most recent four year period is shown in Figure 3.

Food and Fiber System

The Food and Fiber System generates \$685,394 thousand for Jefferson Parish's economy and ranks 8 in GDP among the parish's major industrial sectors. The system includes production agriculture, forestry and fishing sectors as well as food and fiber manufacturing (processing) sectors. These food and fiber product sectors generate \$203,954 thousand and supply 2,744 jobs. The distribution of GDP by each food and fiber product sector is presented in Figure 4.

This Food and Fiber System also includes food service and drinking establishments that generate \$481,439 thousand in GDP and supply 19,554 jobs to the parish.
